Connect's First Twins

Last spring, we shared the discovery of Connect's first TWINS on ultrasound during Tara Zettel's sonography training. Now, approximately 8 months later, Connect has walked with that family through our Earn While You Learn prenatal education program, and are anticipating welcoming those babies into the world any day now!

Alicia Paque came to Connect as an ultrasound model with her husband Miguel. When Tara told them she saw two gestational sacs, Alicia said she was a little shocked, but not too shocked.

"I had known there was a big possibility of having twins as they run in my family," said Alicia. "But I don't think any amount



of knowing can prepare you for finding out you are going to bring two babies home."

Alicia and Miguel have two older daughters, yet still found much value in Connect's Earn While You Learn educational program. "I was refreshed on some topics, learned so much on other topics, and

received the support I needed at this time in my life," said Alicia.

In the height of Covid in the summer of 2020, Connect transitioned to an online education format. This allows couples to watch the lessons and answer the homework questions together at home, then review the lesson with the RN and earn diapers and wipes.

"I felt like I learned something new with each lesson, something I never knew before watching them," said AlicIa. "I appreciated that Deb (Bolin, RN) would take time to go over the lessons with me and share stories or helpful tips from her years of experience."

Deb recently retired from Connect in November of 2021 (see page 2.) During her time with the clinic, she truly became a mentor to many expectant moms like Alicia.

"Deb helped me understand and prepare for the differences I could expect having twins vs. a single pregnancy," said AlicIa. "I have had a lot of worries with this pregnancy, but I felt able to share them with Deb and get validation. She took the time to hear all my concerns and help me laugh through them."

Prior to serving as an ultrasound model, Alicia didn't know Connect existed in Dickinson. Now, she tells everyone she can about the clinic and services.

"They really took the time to get to know me," she said. "I'm so thankful our paths crossed during this time in my life. I needed to have them all in my life."

She added: "There are so many people who will benefit from being surrounded by members of an entire clinic staff who so obviously care and want the best for their patients. Not all clinics are like that, so if they are in a situation where maybe someone is scared or worried, I would say this is the best place for them to come and get the love and support they need during that time in their life."

# **HONORING DEB BOLIN, RN**Nurse Manager Position Changes Hands

Deb Bolin, RN, Connect's nurse manager for the past four years, retired from her position in November, capping off a 44-year nursing career while impacting thousands of expectant women and their families.

Having worked in only four hospitals and clinics the past four decades, Bolin said she was drawn to Connect by its strong faith-based mission and the chance to come alongside women and men from a wide variety of backgrounds.

"It has been rewarding to help people, no matter what the lifestyle they had been living," said Bolin. "I always thought I helped each person a little bit, and it's been great working with a small staff that wants to make a difference."

Tara Zettel, RN, Connect's Executive Director, said Bolin has made an incredible impact on the organization through her positive patient interactions. "Her patients always leave comments reporting that they have felt seen, heard, valued and respected," said Zettel. "I've learned a lot from her as a nurse."

A native of Starkweather, ND, Bolin graduated from the University of Mary in 1976 with a Bachelor of Science in Nursing, and quickly started her nursing career in Mandan. Helping to set the stage, a daytime position opened up in OB, and the position more or less stuck when she moved to Anchorage, Alaska for two years and then 2,700 miles back to Dickinson to the former St. Joseph's Hospital, where she held many titles over 37 years culminating in Director of Obstetrics through 2017.

Shortly thereafter, Connect's former Executive Director Deb Schweitzer called Bolin to ask her to consider becoming the agency's new nurse manager. "Deb and I had known each other for years, and I was familiar with Connect," she said. "Being there was a way for me to continue working part-time while using so much information on labor and delivery and women's health I had gleaned over the years."

While investing her time as a nurse, Bolin also was an adjunct faculty member in the Nursing Department at Dickinson State University for 15 years – all while raising three children, including Eric, 43 of Fargo; Shanna, 36 of Grand Forks; and Ryan 33, of Germany.

Replacing Bolin is Chelsey Crone, a former labor and delivery nurse at CHI St. Alexius Hospital.

"I have a heart for people and I'm excited to serve women and men in our community," said Crone. "I love that Connect offers a welcoming, confidential setting to connect with patients oneon-one in a less-rushed atmosphere where we can really listen, support and educate."



"I'm excited to have Chelsey join the Connect team," said Zettel. "I'm so grateful for everything Deb has given the mission and look forward to what is coming next."

Chelsey Crone assumed the Nurse Manager role in December, 2021.

# JANUARY Cervical Cancer Awareness Month

Facts According to the American Cancer Society:

- Cervical cancer was once one of the most common causes of cancer death for American women.
- The cervical cancer death rate dropped significantly with the increased use of the <u>Pap test</u>. This screening procedure can find changes in the cervix before cancer develops. It can also find cervical cancer early when it's small and easier to cure.



- Cervical cancer is most frequently diagnosed in women between the ages of 35 and 44, with the average diagnosis at 50. Many older women do not realize that the risk of developing cervical cancer is still present as they age.
- More than 20% of cases of cervical cancer are found in women over 65.
- However, these cancers rarely occur in women who have been getting regular tests to screen for cervical cancer before they were 65.
