

EDUCATION THAT CONNECTS AND EMPOWERS

Fall means back to school for students and our RNs returning to classroom presentations. Medical Director Dr. Thomas Arnold shares why these visits are a priority to the mission.

Connect Medical Clinic (CMC) was founded on the essential tenet that all patients deserve respectful, professional evidence-based sexual health medical services and education. The four fundamental values upon which the clinic fosters this medical care include *access, education, empowerment and purpose.

The care appreciated by CMC patients can only occur if they are aware of the Connect Medical Clinic's capabilities. Unplanned pregnancy and sexual health intervention can only happen if patients have a previous familiarity with available clinic services.

This familiarity is nurtured best by introduction of that individual to the clinic prior to an urgent situation, during a time of normal health or a marginally critical situation.

High school and college-age young adults have a well-recognized lack of understanding of basic reproductive physiology and have emerging hormonal tendencies and increased social pressures that place them at high risk for unplanned pregnancy and STIs. Often at a time when they have no established healthcare provider.

What better time and opportunity is there than routine school sessions to introduce the CMC clinic services? Situationally sensitive menstrual cycle instruction, reproductive health education and a discussion of avoiding sexual health mis-events can have considerable impact.

It is imperative that students understand that circumstances are temporary, but consequences are permanent when it comes to taking care of themselves.

Connect Medical Clinic can better realize our mission objectives by extending our educational resources into the area schools.
